SAIBT is for students who:

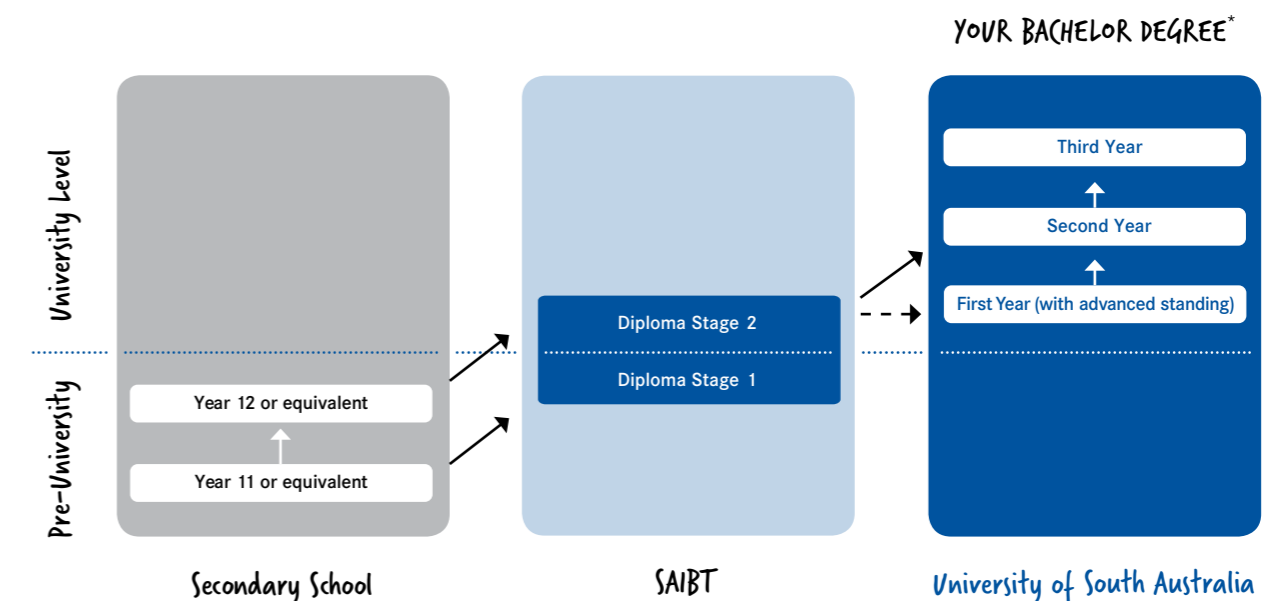
- Successfully complete Year 11
