
# YOUR PATHWAY TO A DEGREE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

SAIBT offers an accelerated pathway to UniSA. Australian citizens, permanent residents and international students choosing the SAIBT pathway will graduate with their SAIBT Diploma and then have the option to continue directly into the second year of over 90 Bachelor Degrees at UniSA.


SAIBT is for students who:

- Successfully complete Year 11
- Complete Year 12 but do not attain an ATAR
- Do not meet ATAR entrance requirements to get directly into UniSA
- Do not complete enough SACE subjects at high school
- Are a mature-aged student who does not meet mature-age university entry requirements (assessed case-by-case)


